**NOTE:** Walk-ins are welcome and given appointments until capacity is reached. This is to ensure each of our clients receives adequate attention for their appointment time.

ACIP recommends use of COVID-19 vaccines for everyone ages 12 and older within the scope of the Emergency Use Authorization for the particular vaccine. COVID-19 vaccine and other vaccines may be administered on the same day.
