CISD DISTRICT ACADEMIC GOALS

To increase academic achievement for all students in RAMS, we must work together to increase student literacy and competency in math and science. We will get there by increasing students':

- Literacy skills by reading Non-fiction text and exploring media literacy
- Developing a better number sense and be able to articulate mathematical reasoning in written form.

RAMS ACADEMIC GOALS

Richard Allie administrators, parents and teachers have evaluated our student performance data to determine areas of improvement.

- By May 2024, 65% of students will approach grade level on Reading STAAR test.
- By May 2024, 90% of Black, Latinx, and lowincome students considered on-track (>95% attendance, 0 ISS/OSS events, < 5 Course Failures in ELA or Math)



All teachers will work with students and parents to support student's success in math and reading. Some key connections with families will be:

- Provide consistent communication with families about students' academic and social progress.
- Provide students hands-on opportunities and weekly activities to apply and review lessons in a meaningful, real-world application.
- Host Fun Fridays and Team Recognition award ceremonies to recognize outstanding academic and social progress..





Students will join staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and become super stars in Math, Science, English, History, CTE, and electives. Some things to consider in making the connection between home and school are:

- Attend tutoring when primary instruction does not sink in the first time.
- Empower others through positive, growth-related dialogue.
- Hold themselves to a high standard in all aspects—at home and school.



Parents will show continued support for their student's educational goals. Families will support students in reaching math and reading goals. Some key strategies for supporting students at home will be:

- Set aside one night per week to apply the standards to real world situations outside of homework and classwork. (i.e. finances, banking, etc.)
- Encourage your family and students to attend and participate in the quarterly teacher-led workshops and parent events.
