

CONSENT AGENDA

Approved the April 26 Regular Board Meeting Minutes, the May 7 Called Board Meeting Minutes, the CISD and Crowley City Council Joint Meeting Minutes as well as the May 17 and May 21 Called Board Meeting Minutes.

Approved the April Financial Statements.

Approved **Budget Amendment** to move funds for testing materials, reference materials for teachers, Admin Retreat and to pay for Teach Transform licenses from Lead4Ward.

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Approved a **Request for Proposal (RFP) for Armed Courier Services** with Texas Star Security and approved a pool of seven commercial **Commercial Real Estate Brokerage Firms** as part of an RFQ for a Commercial Real Estate Broker.

Approved the **2018-19 Education Service Center ESC Region XI Crowley ISD Renewal Contract** Summary and Master Local Interlocal Agreement.

Approved **Regional Day School Program for the Deaf (RDSPD) Shared Agreement**. Crowley ISD serves as the fiscal agent for the Crowley Regional Day School Program for the Deaf (RDSPD). Member districts for the 2018-19 school year will include: Alvarado, Burleson, Cleburne, Crowley, Everman, Joshua, Johnson County Shared Services Arrangement (Keene, Grandview, Godley and Rio Vista). Crowley ISD and member districts of the Crowley Regional Day School Program have reviewed the current Shared Services Agreement (SSA) in relation to the proposed guidance requirements from TEA. Crowley ISD will remain the fiscal agent as well as the district of accountability. Transportation will continue to be the responsibility of the district of residence. The RDSPD is funded through state and federal Deaf Education monies as well as tuition from the seven member districts.

Approved **District of Innovation Plan Possible Amendments.** The District of Innovation advisory committee recommended amendments to Crowley ISD's District of Innovation Plan related to teacher certification and required field-based experience that will give the district more flexibility to fill positions in Career and Technical Education (CTE) as well as non-traditional, industry-based courses. An amendment related to kindergarten start age also was recommended that will give more flexibility to enroll students in school sooner so they can be immersed in an academic environment and develop a strong foundation.

Approved Local Policy Updates recommended by the Policy Review Committee (PRC) in response to Curriculum Audit Recommendations. The Cabinet and PRC has diligently reviewed board policies recommended in the Curriculum Audit as well as board policies older than three years and/or Priority Policies required to be reviewed annually.

Approved **Contract Renewal with Weaver – Independent Audit Firm**. The district must contract with an independent auditor annually to be in compliance, per the Texas Education Agency. The renewal letter states a fee of \$47,000 for performing the external audit for the year ending June 2018.

REPORT ITEM/PRESENTATION

Heard an **Innovating Programming Update** about choice expansion, Tarleton fellowships and CTE externships.

Heard a **2018 Summer Programming Update**. Crowley ISD is offering a variety of summer learning programs for students of all ages in June, July and August. The programs include enrichment, remediation, credit recovery, academic camps and more.

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Heard an update on the **CISD Literacy Bus**, which will provide academic enrichment to students in various locations throughout the summer. This project has been created through collaborations with Durham, Aramark and CISD. North Crowley High School student Brooke Teal created the graphic design displayed on the bus.

Approved Acceptance of Donation from Sue Crouch Intermediate School PTA. The Sue Crouch Intermediate School PTA donated six outdoor tables for outdoor classroom activities. The tables have an estimated total value of \$5,000.

Approved Investment Policy Review and Resolution.

Discussed the Texas Association of School Boards (TASB) Letter Regarding Resolutions To Be Included in the 2018-2020 Advocacy Agenda.

Approved a **Memorandum of Understanding with Child Care Associates.** The memorandum of understanding for Child Care Associates-Head Start is for the 2018-19 school year to serve two full-day pre-kindergarten classrooms for 3-year-old students. The cost is \$61,000 for paraprofessional salaries and curriculum kits.

Approved rejecting the responses to the **Strategic Planning RFP** until a later date, at which time another RFP may be released.

FUTURE ACTION ITEMS

The board is invited to nominate a CISD trustee for a position on **board of the Texas Association of School Boards** (TASB). The position term is three years.

Heard update on **contract renewal with Tarrant County Tax Assessor/Collector** to collect Crowley ISD ad valorem taxes.

Heard update on the **Notice of Public Hearing to Discuss Budget and Proposed Tax Rate**. The public meeting is scheduled for 6 p.m. June 28.

Heard update on **vendor renewal for 21st Century and Sports Tutoring 3rd Party Support**. Clayton Youth Enrichment Services is the district's third-party provider for the Sports and Tutoring after-school grant.

Heard update on the **2018-19 Compensation Plan**. It will be brought for approval at the June 28 board meeting and discussed at the June 14 budget workshop.
