What is it?

When it sticks the top part of its head out of the burrow, it can see what's above the ground.

What do they do?

It curls up into a ball and falls asleep. In the spring, mother groundhogs welcome litters of babies. Babies stay with their mothers for several months. Then they go and get their own food. When winter comes again, they are ready for it.
- 3) Groundhogs are seen on the ground most of the time. However, they can climb trees and swim in lakes and rivers. They like to roam around in the woods. They really enjoy open fields, roads, and streams. These mammals like to eat and eat and eat.

What do they eat?





Antlers


- Moose have them.
